AATWIN urges NHRC to recommend the Govt. for the ratification of the UN Protocol to Prevent, Suppress and Punish Trafficking in Persons Especially Women and Children

Lalitpur: Alliance Against Trafficking of Women in Nepal (AATWIN) submitted a memorandum to the National Human Rights Commission today with regard to the recommendation to the government for the ratification of the UN Protocol to Prevent, Suppress and Punish Trafficking in Persons Especially Women and Children.

Submitting the memorandum, AATWIN has requested the Commission to pledge to make an initiative for the effective implementation of the Guidelines, 2009 and the formulation of the Act with regard to the control over pervasive sex exploitation in entertainment sector such as the dance bars.

The delegation led by Meena Bista, the Chair of AATWIN said that the memorandum has been submitted urging the Commission to mount pressure on the government for the prevention and control of the human trafficking.

On the occasion, receiving the memorandum, the Commissioner and Spokesperson Mohna Ansari stressed on the need of concerted efforts in the government level to prevent and control human trafficking. She added that all need to collaborate from their fields in this regard.

On the occasion, growing crime of human trafficking was pointed out despite the fact that the continuous efforts were made in national and international level for a long time. As observed in recent years, the transnational human trafficking is committed in different forms and trends. It's high time that the bilateral exchange of information between the country of transport and destination country including the establishment of legal mechanisms are further enhanced to prevent and control new trend and form of trafficking, to punish the perpetrators and to provide justice to the victims.

The delegation representing AATWIN has drawn the attention of the Commission towards making recommendation to the government to advance the ratification process of the United Nations Protocols against Transnational Organized Crime.
